What is an Enduring Power of Attorney?

An Enduring Power of Attorney (EPOA) is a document which you sign giving your authority to a nominated person to operate your financial affairs on your behalf.

Why make an Enduring Power of Attorney?

An EPOA safeguards your affairs should you become ill, senile or incapable of running your affairs. An example could be allowing your next of kin to access your state pension on your behalf.

When can I make an Enduring Power of Attorney?

It can be made today and placed with your Will. It can be used immediately or can be restricted until your doctor confirms in writing that you are incapable of running your own affairs.

What if I wait before I make an Enduring Power of Attorney?

If you delay and become mentally unsound you will not be able to sign documentation. This could then result in your next of kin having to apply to the High Court to be appointed as Controller of your affairs.

What if I change my mind?

Whilst you are mentally capable you can cancel the EPOA at any time by simply letting us know.
